"Value is simply the artistic term for light and dark. An area's value is its relative lightness or darkness in a given context."



- 3. Experiment with different shaped text boxes, text on a path, runarounds, and text indents.
- 4. Learn how to set up your artwork for a full bleed.
- 5. Use column guides and ruler guides as an aid in designing the page.
